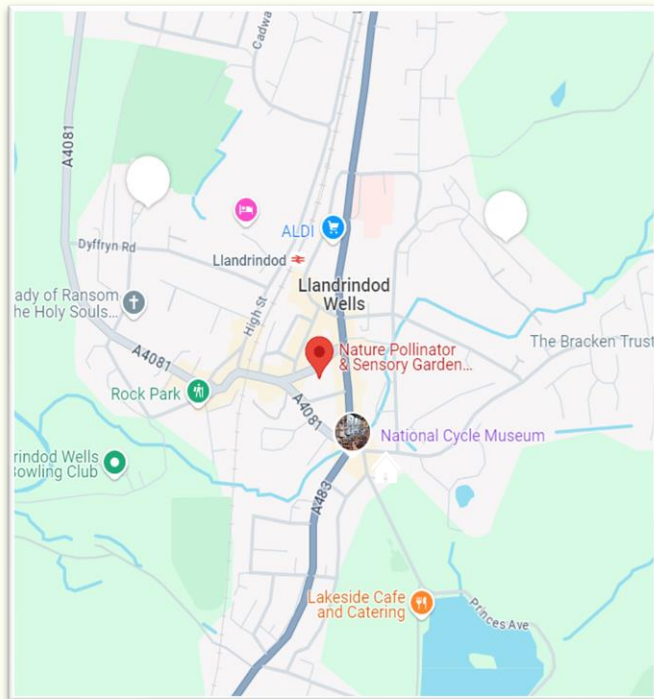




Nurture Our Nature Garden Llandrindod Wells

A perfect space to take a moment in nature



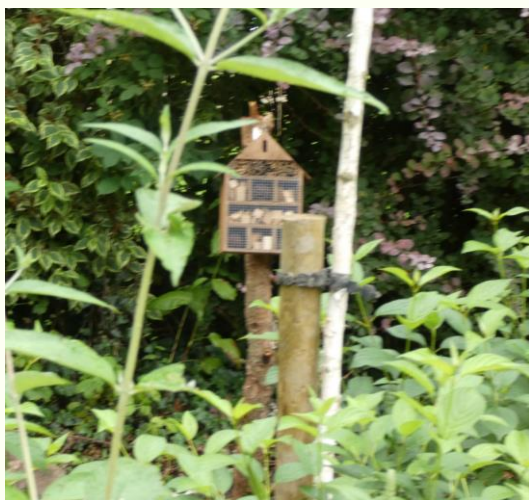

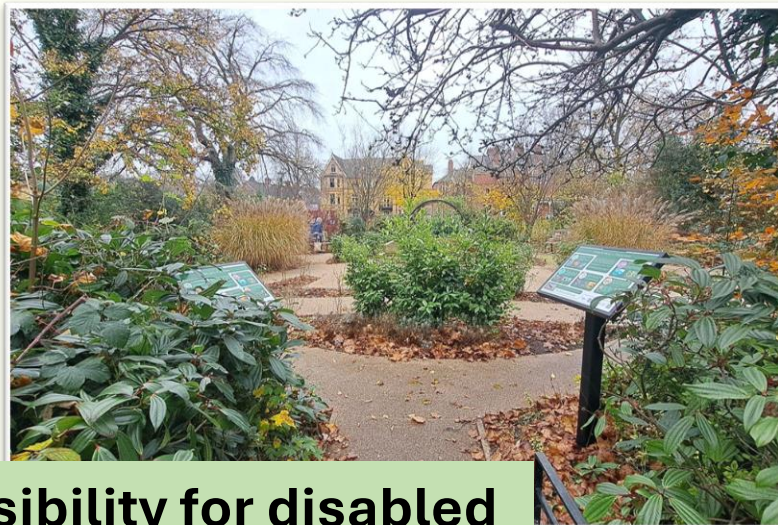
